- By completing 8 steps our school will be showing our commitment to these goals and be awarded a **Yellow Flag**

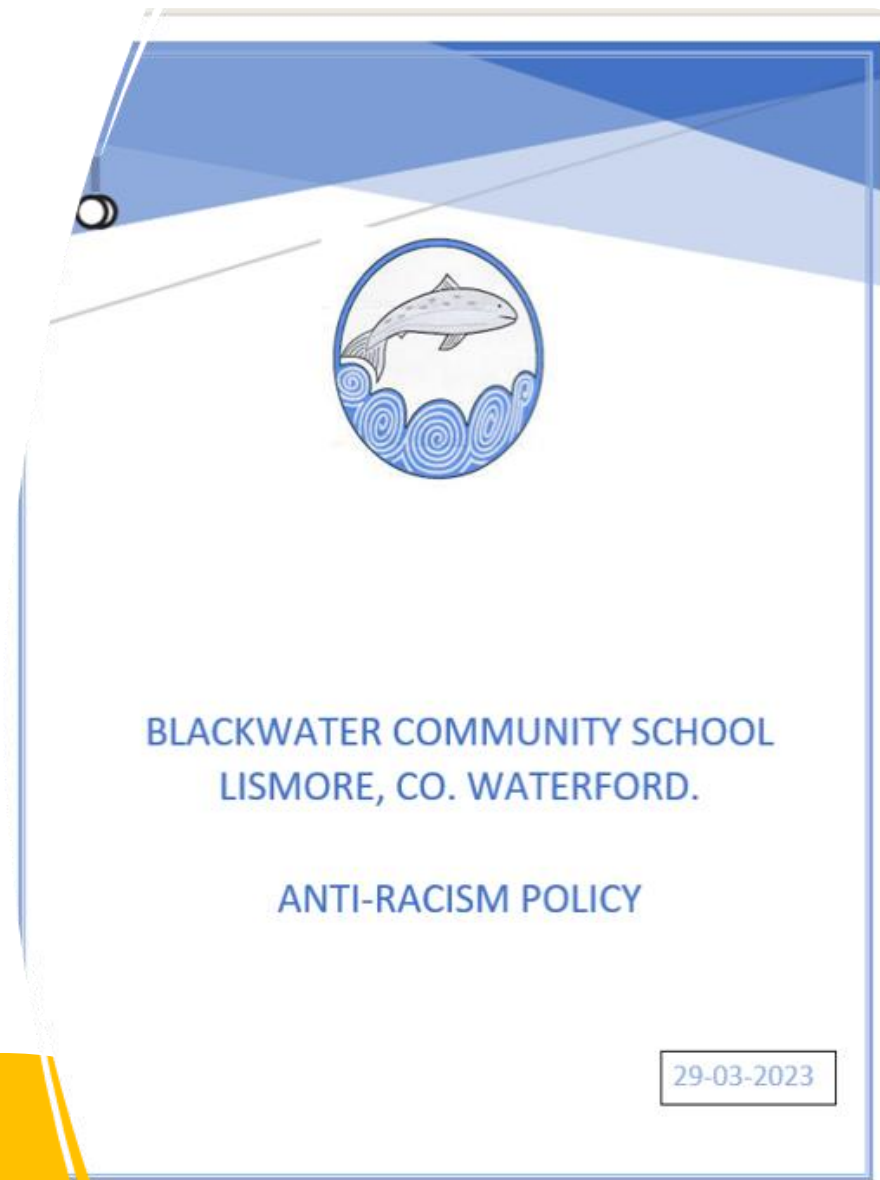

BCS Anti-Racism Policy

- The Yellow Flag Diversity Committee liaised with school leaders to create our BCS Anti-Racism Policy.

What is the difference between a racist incident and bullying?

- A racist incident is behavior, language, practice or policy that makes a person 'feel unwelcome or marginalized because of their colour, culture, religion, ethnicity or national origin'



- Bullying is an intentional, targeted and unwanted negative behaviour that is **repeated** against a person who has difficulty defending themselves.

How to report a racist incident:

Student reports racist incidents to a member of staff/year head/deputy principal/principal. Student fills out a racist incident report form.

Staff report racist incidents to year head/ deputy principal/ principal.
