

<u>Update on the National evaluation of Children and Young People's Services</u> <u>Committees (CYPSC).</u>



The Centre for Effective Services

The evaluation is moving at a quick pace, in accordance with the plan agreed with DCEDIY, and we at the CES would like to update you on our activities in the next few weeks. These activities may require your help or involvement, so please read carefully:

Activity 1: Preliminary analysis of data from the *Survey of Coordinators, Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons*: The survey had 42 respondents and includes a wealth of quantitative and qualitative data. We have started a preliminary analysis of the data to inform the next steps below and gain answers to the evaluation questions. We will conduct a full analysis of the data once all data collection for the evaluation is complete in August.

Activity 2: Organise and facilitate online focus groups with *Coordinators, Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons*: Thank you to everyone who volunteered to take part in an online focus group in the coming weeks. A member of the evaluation team will email you directly by the end of the week with further information on this. <u>If you did not</u> <u>complete the survey, but would like to take part in a focus group, please contact</u> <u>kmcgrath@effectiveservices.org</u>

Activity 3: Design and distribute the *Survey for CYPSC Members and Collaborating Organisations*: We are currently designing a second survey which is intended for all members of the CYPSC main committees and sub-committees, as well as organisations who are not members of your CYPSC but who may collaborate with your CYPSC on certain projects. <u>This survey is **not** for Coordinators, Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons</u>. It will be a shorter version of the survey you recently completed and the questions we ask in it will be informed by the preliminary analysis of the Survey for Coordinators, Chairpersons and Vice-Chairpersons. The survey will open for 3 weeks, starting in the last week of May (the exact date is to be decided). <u>We ask you to please raise</u> <u>awareness of the survey amongst your members and encourage them to complete it when it</u> <u>opens</u>. Their feedback is an important part of the evaluation.

Activity 4: Organise and facilitate an online focus group for Young People (aged 18+) on the CYPSC membership: We will be arranging an online focus group for young people (aged 18+) who are members of a CYPSC main or sub-committee, or who have been involved in some way with the work of CYPSC (e.g. through youth forum or Comhairle na nÓg). In the first instance, we will seek expressions of interest amongst young people who complete the *Survey of CYPSC Members and Collaborating Organisations*.

Thank you again for your participation and cooperation with the evaluation, we greatly appreciate it.
