













The Third Level Ladder





POINTS SYSTEM CONTD.

- Points are calculated from ONE sitting of the Leaving Certificate only.
- Points total is calculated from SIX best subjects.
- 25 Bonus points are awarded for Honours Mathematics.
 - for a grade H6 and above.





Use the free Change of Mind facility from early May to 1 July at 5pm to make changes to your application - restrictions apply.

Carefully check the Statement of Application Record when it is sent to you in May and inform CAO of any errors or omissions immediately. Round One Offers are issued as soon as possible after the release of the Leaving Certificate results. If you are accepting an offer you must do so by the reply date on the offer. Other categories of applicant may receive offer notifications before this

time.

Applicants who do not receive a Round One Offer will receive a Statement of Application email. Please check this statement carefully and inform CAO of any errors or omissions. 10

Offers are issued to eligible applicants until the offer season closes, or until all of the places have been filled, whichever comes first




WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

Alternative route to Education

Suits the Tactile/Kinesthetic learner

Combines both on the job training and off the job training

APPRENTICESHIP PHASES



RESEARCH



What industry would you like to work in?



Check out the type of work being done in the apprenticeship areas of interest to you



See the work first hand – **ask questions/ do work experience**



Find out about the potential career opportunities at the end of the apprenticeship

FIND AN EMPLOYER

- Investigate apprentice job opportunities with local employers
- 2. Look for apprenticeship job vacancies
- 3. Follow companies on social media to learn more about them and opportunities that may arise
- 4. Register for notifications on job websites
- 5. Inform your local Employment office

REGISTRATION



Step 1: Find an approved employer



Step 2: Your employer will register you within two weeks of recruitment



Step 3: You must meet the stated educational requirements and for a small number of apprenticeships a colour blindness test

WHAT WILL HELP?

- 1. Work experience
- 2. Higher grades of entry than those suggested by SOLAS are preferred for certain apprenticeships, (e.g. electrician) due to the technical nature of the trade. Employers typically seek applicants who have completed Leaving Cert including Maths.

ACCOMMODATION
